1. Legal Authority

1.1 Pursuant to section 38 (6) of the Civil Aviation Act, “the Executive Director may issue an Aviation Directive (“AD”) comprised of a permission, approval or procedure, or the imposition of a condition, restriction or prohibition which the Executive Director believes on reasonable grounds to be –

- a) consistent with the objectives of applicable regulatory requirements, procedures or documents; and
- b) necessary and expedient to better achieve the objects of the Act”.

1.2 This AD sets in place requirements for issue of remote pilot instructor certificates.

2. Background

There is currently no guidance in the regulations on the issue of remote pilot instructor certificates. While there is approved aviation training organisations for remote piloted aircraft systems (RPAS), the authority needs a legal mechanism to issue the approval of an RPAS instructor.

3. Purpose

This directive aims to provide the legal framework for the issue of RPAS instructor certificates so that qualifying RPAS pilots can to give instruction at approved RPAS training organisations.

4. Applicability

This directive applies to all RPAS Pilots authorised in terms of NAMCAR Part 101 and directive NCAA 1/2/3-6, and to RPAS training organisations approved in terms of NAMCAR Part 141.



5. Effective Date

This directive shall be effective from 30 October 2021 until cancelled or superseded by promulgated relevant regulations or a revised substitution.

6. References

The following regulations are referred to in this document:

- a) NAMCAR Part 101, 2020 as amended; and
- b) NAMCAR Part 141, 2001 as amended.

7. Action Required

- 7.1 The Namibia Civil Aviation Authority (NCAA) may issue a certificate to an RPAS pilot for the purpose of giving instruction and issuing certificates of competency to RPAS pilots, providing they meet the criteria outlined in this directive.
- 7.2 The format of the certificate is provided in Annexure A to this directive.
- 7.3 The certificate referred to in 7.1 shall permit the holder to give instruction and competency certificates to RPAS pilots when working under an NCAA approved RPAS training organisation and in accordance with the organisation's approved manual of procedure.
- 7.4 A pilot aspiring for an RPAS instructor certificate shall apply to PEL using form FSS PEL 61.08 accompanied by the pilot's summarised and ATO certified logbook, an instructional techniques course certificate provided by an approved training organisation, an RPAS certificate of competency issued by an approved RPAS training organisation, and the prescribed fee in Part 187.
- 7.5 Notwithstanding paragraph 7.4 above, an applicant who has held or who holds a Namibian flight instructor rating, type rated instructor, or designated examiner appointment shall not be required to submit an instructional techniques course.




- 7.6 The applicant referred to in para 7.4 above shall have accrued in their logbook a minimum of 40 hours logged RPAS operational time.
- 7.7 The instructor certificate referred to in para 7.1 shall be valid for a period of two years from the date of issue.
- 7.8 An instructor certificate referred to in para 7.1 shall be deemed valid from the date of its expiry if the conditions for renewal are met within 90 days prior to its expiry with the renewal application completed on form FSS PEL 61.08 accompanied by a valid RPAS instructor certificate of competency, the pilot's certified logbook, the previous certificate, and the prescribed fee in Part 187.
- 7.9 An applicant will have to pass a skills test for the reissuance of the RPAS instructor certificate if the certificate is left to lapse. In this case, the reissued certificate will be rendered valid from the date of passing of the skills test.

8. Enforceability of the Directive

This directive shall be enforceable to all participating Part 141 approved Aviation Training Organisations, pilots authorised in terms of NAMCAR Part 101 and directive NCAA 1/2/3-6 from the 91st day following the date of publication of the directive.
